Risen Christ, your wounds declare your love for the world and the wonder of your risen life: give us compassion and courage to risk ourselves for those we serve, to the glory of God the Father.

Acts 8.26-40

26 Then an angel of the Lord said to Philip, 'Get up and go towards the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.' (This is a wilderness road.) 27So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship 28and was returning home; seated in his

chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. 29Then the Spirit said to Philip, 'Go over to this chariot and join it.' 30So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, 'Do you understand what you are reading?' 31He replied, 'How can I, unless someone guides me?' And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. 32Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this: 'Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth.

33 In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation?

For his life is taken away from the earth.' 34The eunuch asked Philip, 'About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?' 35Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. 36As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, 'Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?'38He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. 39When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. 40But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

John 15.1-8

I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. 2He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. 3You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. 4Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. 51 am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. 6Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. 7If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. 8My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples.

Eco tip -

Last Monday, 22nd April, was 'Earth Day'. The theme this year was 'Planet versus Plastic'. The organisers are aiming for a 60% reduction in plastic production by 2040 and to eliminate single-use

plastics by 2030 to make a healthier planet. Did you know that:

- Plastic accounts for 3.4% of global greenhouse gas emissions.
- Nearly 80% of all plastics humankind has ever created still exist in the environment and landfills.
- Plastic has been found in our lungs and our blood.
- In two decades, the amount of plastic we produce has doubled, from 234m tonnes in 2000, to 460m tonnes in 2019.
- Plastic can take up to 500 years to decompose, and even then it never fully disappears.
- Over 99% of plastic is made from chemicals sourced from fossil fuels.

How can we reduce the amount of plastic we use? Some tips include buying loose veg instead of the bagged stuff, using a bar of soap or shampoo instead of plastic bottles, storing food in reusable tubs instead of using cling film. And when you have to use plastic, recycle as much as possible through your green bin (bottles) supermarket (plastic bags) or the bins provided by the city council outside Tesco on the Havant Road (hard plastic containers).
